State of South Carolina Know all men by these Greenville District Presents that I William Harrer of said District for an in consideration of the sum of six hundred dollars to me paid by Stephen Philips of said District the receipt there of I do hereby acknowledge, Have granted sold & released and by these presents do grant bargain sell & release unto the said Stephen Philips a certain plantation or tract of land lying & being in Greenville District on the south side of Saluda River containing fifty acres more or less. beginning where said Brummitts upper line crosses the middle fork of Saluda River thence down the river to the mouth of the second branch thence up the said branch to the first holler near the old field thence to the said Brummitts upper line for complement being part of a tract of land said Brummitt then lived on including the House & plantation wheron the said Wm Harrer now lives also one other tract or parcel of land laying on both sides of Lick Log branch or branch of the middle fork of Saluda River in the District aforesaid beginning at a black gum stake on the north side of S. branch thence S. 35° W. 70. to a red oak thence 15° - 75 thence N. 69° W. 3° to a red oak 16. thence N. 27° W. 3° to a chestnut 18 thence N. 26° E. 3° to a red oak 25.50 thence N. 73° E. 3° to stake or thence to the beginning containing one hundred & twenty six acres more or less Only one other tract or parcel of land laying the north side of the middle fork of Saluda River —
