

I know all men by these presents that I Boley banner
 of the state of Georgia and County of Franklin have
 this day Bargained and sold unto Anna Woodson of the
 State of South Carolina and Greenville District a certain
 tract or parcel of land lying and being in the State and
 District and State aforesaid on both sides of Mountain
 Creek of Saluda River containing by computation one
 hundred and forty two acres be the same more or less for the
 sum of one hundred and forty two dollars to me in hand
 paid by the said Anna Woodson the receipt whereof is
 hereby acknowledged it being a part of a tract of land
 granted to William Wood on the first day of May one thousand
 and seven hundred and eighty six beginning on a rock
 and running S. 86° E 16 chains to a tight wood State corner on
 Beales line thence S. 10° E 91 chains to Uriah Statens Hickory corner
 on said line thence a long said Statens line a cross mountain
 creek to his State corner thence on James Cumpston line to
 the West line of the original Survey of said Wood thence N. 4°
 E to the beginning corner which said tract a parcel of land
 have granted bargained and sold unto the said Anna
 Woodson & her heirs for ever and I the said Boley banner
 will forever warrant and defend the Right of said land
 from me and against myself my heirs and Executors and Adminis-
 trators unto the said Anna Woodson her heirs and assigns
 forever. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
 and affixed my seal this fourteenth day of November in the
 year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and four
then signed sealed and delivered in presence of us

 the use and purpose written mentioned and that
