 all and singular the said premises unto the said John T. Clark
 his heir and assigns against myself and my heirs and against
 every other person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim
 the same or any part thereof Witness my hand and seal this
 sixth day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand
 eight hundred and Eighteen and in the forty third year of
 the Independence of the United States of America
