In witness whereof I the said Dudley Howell have hereunto set my hand and seal this 2nd day of May 1815.

The State of South Carolina, know all men by these presents that I Jacob Summey of the district of Greenville, and State aforesaid, for and in consideration of the sum of one thousand dollars to me paid by Doctor Thomas G Walker of the district and State aforesaid, have granted, bargained, sold, and released; and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said Doctor Thomas G Walker, one certain Lot, piece, or parcel of Land containing one Acre ~~be the same more or less~~ within the bounds herein after mentioned situate lying and being in the village at Greenville Court House, in the state and district aforesaid, lying without the limits of the plan or chart of the said village, as heretofore laid off by Col Weston and recorded in the Clerk's office at Greenville, but as a corner Lot fronting two hundred and thirtyfive feet on North Boundary Street, and one hundred and forty feet on main Street Beginning at a stake, on the west side of main street ninety feet above the North East Corner of Lot numbered in the plan of said village fifty one, so as to leave North Boundary street between them running thence North 17 $\frac{1}{2}$ degrees East one hundred and forty feet to a stake, thence North 72 $\frac{1}{2}$ degrees West two hundred and thirtyfive feet to a stake, thence south 17 $\frac{1}{2}$ degrees East one hundred and forty feet to a stake, thence south 72 $\frac{1}{2}$ degrees East to the beginning, intending to range in correspondence with the streets and buildings of the original plan of said village which said lot of land was conveyed by warranty -
