P. Brockman his heirs or assigns the above amount of Eightyone Dollars and fifty five cents With in trust from the 1st day of July last past on or before the 1st day of January next, then the above obligation to be null and void otherwise to remain in full force in law and Equity, given under my Hand and seal this the 11th day of March in the year of our Lord one Thousand Eight Hundred and Twenty four and in the forty eighth year of the American Independence signed sealed & acknowledged,
