The State of South Carolina, to all to whom these presents shall come greeting, know, ye, that in pursuance of an act of the Legislature, entitled, an act for Establishing the mode of granting the lands now vacant in this state, and for allowing a commutation to be received for some lands that have been granted passed the 19th day of February 1791 We have granted, and by these presents do grant unto Samuel Earle his heirs and assigns, a plantation or tract of land, containing five hundred acres surveyed for him the 4th day of June 1799 situate in the district of Washington Greenback County bounded by a line running South West by Samuel Earle's Land South unknown East by Thomas Wadsworth's North East by John Ford and John Mathewy on the Branches of middle and North fork of Saluda River having such shape form and marks, as are represented by a plat hereunto annexed together with all woods, trees, waters, water courses, profits, commodities, appurtenances, and hereditaments whatsoever thereunto belonging to have and to hold the said tract of five hundred acres of land, and all and singular other the premises hereby granted unto the said Samuel Earle his heirs and assigns for ever, in full and common socage, given under the Great Seal of the State, witness his excellency Edward Rutledge Governor and Commander in Chief in and over the said State at Columbia this fifth day of August anno domini one thousand seven hundred and ninety nine and in the twenty fourth year of the independence of the United States of America
