

South Carolina Know all men by these presents that I James Rop of Greenville District for and in consideration of the love and parental affection on the one to my son William Rop have given granted and bequeathed and do by these presents give grant and bequeath unto the said William Rop a tract or plantation of Land in the district of Greenville aforesaid whereon he now lives Beginning at a stake on the so side of of Beaver dam creek a branch of Middle Tyger and running thence so. 31. ch. 50 Pk. to a stake thence East. 11 ch. 25. Pk. to a Hickory thence so. 50. E. 21 ch. to a stake thence N. 68. E. 26 ch. to an Iron wood Saplin on the bank of the Creek aforesaid thence up the meanders thereof to the beginning containing by Estimation One hundred and twenty three acres be the same more or less the same being the West end of the tract I now live on and that I purchased of John Burke & Co. Together with all and singular the Rights members hereditaments and appurtenances thereunto belong or in any wise appertaining to have and to hold the above mentioned premises unto the said William Rop his heirs & assigns for ever and I do hereby bind myself my heirs or Executors to warrant and defend the above mentioned premises unto the said William Rop his heirs or assigns against me and my heirs and against every person or persons lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 29 day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & twenty four and 48th year of American Independence signed sealed & delivered in presence of William Johnson Willey J. Brown James Rop & Robt. Rop South Carolina Personallly Came William Johnson before me and in a de oath that he saw James Rop sign seal & deliver the within Bequeath unto William Willey J. Brown was witness to the due of the same sworn and subscribed to this 29 day of July 1824 (4) before me Thomas Stanford J. Wm Johnson
