 beginning Together with all and singular the Right, members
 hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises
 beloning or in any wise incident or appertaining to have
 and to hold all and singular the premises before men-
 tioned unto the said Linsay A. Baker his heirs and assigns
 forever And we do hereby bind our selves and each
 of our heirs Executors and administrators to warrant
 and forever defend all and singular the premises before
 mentioned unto the said Linsay A. Baker his heirs
 and assigns forever against us ourselves and each
 of our heirs lawfully claiming or to claim the
 same or any part thereof witness my hand and seal
 this second day of February in the year of our Lord
 One thousand eight hundred and twenty five and in
 the forty ninth year of the Independence of the United States
