 That I James Edwards, of Greenville District in the state  
 aforesaid, for and in Consideration of the sum of one  
 Hundred dollars to me in hand paid by Claibon Waddill  
 of the district aforesaid have granted bargained sold and  
 released and by these presents do grant bargain sell  
 and Release unto the said Claibon Waddill part of  
 a tract of land which I purchased from William =  
 Turner, being in Greenville district, on Morgans Creek begining  
 on a chestnut corner thence S. 13. W. 34. To a poplar, thence  
 S. 87. E. till it intersects William Edwards line thence  
 N. 25. W. to a R. O. thence to the beginning corner conta-  
 ining one hundred acres the same more or less together  
 with all and singular the rights members hereditarie  
 str and appertaining to the said premises belonging  
 or in any wise incident or appertaining to the same  
 to have and to hold all and singular the premises  
 before mentioned unto the said Claibon Waddill his  
 heirs and assigns forever, and I do hereby bind my self  
 my heirs Executors and administrators to warrant  
 and forever defend all and singular the said premises  
 unto the said Claibon Waddill, his heirs and  
 assigns, against my self and my heirs and against  
 every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or  
 to claim the same or any part thereof witness  
 my hand and seal this 30th day of July 1825  
 one thousand Eight hundred and twenty one signed  
 and acknowledged in presence  
 of Just Joseph <sup>mark</sup> Edwards 3<sup>rd</sup> of his  
 mark Edwards 3<sup>rd</sup> James T Edwards

South Carolina 3<sup>rd</sup> Joseph Edwards came before me

 conveyance to Claibon Waddill for the use and  
 purposes within mentioned and doth further say that Thomas  
 = Edwards was an affixing witness with him self two  
 m<sup>r</sup> to and subscribed before me this 2<sup>nd</sup> day of May 1825
