 ents, and in consideration of one hundred and twenty
 five dollars the price of so. land according to the
 valuation of the commissioners, to us in hand paid
 by Wiley Kemp, we do grant & relinquish and forever
 quit claim of the above mentioned parcel of land -
 unto the said Wiley Kemp his heirs assigns Executors
 or administrators free from the claim of ourselves
 our heirs assigns, Executors, and administrators, given
 this 1st M^r Mason, Matthew Hudson, George Ross, E. P.
 Peter Shocketley seal
