 south 350 to a rock corner, thence S 48 E 3.88 to a poplar on the bank of a small
 creek, thence down the meanders of said creek about 23 to a stake 3x on the
 old line, thence West 7.70 to a stake, thence South 24.50 to a stake 3x thence
 S 15 to a black oak 3x thence N 35 E 21 to a red oak 3x thence N 52 E 10.70
 a pine, thence East 13.50 to a stake on the old boundary line, thence North
 along said line 32 to the beginning bounded on the North by Alexander Peden
 the west by John Stenis on the South by William Choice, and on the East by
 Kelly T Sullivan &c including the house and plantation where the said John T.
 Peden formerly lived with one hundred and thirty eight acres of land be the
 same more or less. Together with all and singular the rights, members, heri-
 taments and appurtenances to the same belonging or in anywise incident or
 pertaining. To have and to hold all and singular the premises above mentioned
 unto the said Robert Peden his heirs and assigns for ever, and I the said John Peden
 bind my self, my heirs executors Administrators to warrant and for ever defend
 and singular the said premises unto the said Robert Peden from my self &
 heirs and from every other person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to
