Be it known to all it may concern that I have loaned to my daughter Eliza E Thompson, and for her exclusive use two negroes, a girl called Tempy, and a boy named George, belonging to the estate of my deceased daughter Susannah Mc Gurt, and bequeathed to me in trust to be disposed of according to my direction, until I have leisure to make such a settlement as the will points out. I think proper to signify to the world at large that the property is for the present on loan. Merely
