 Rowlandy line to a ash in a Branch thence down said Branch
 to a maple thence up said Branch to a Post Oak Corner thence
 along Court to a Spanish Oak thence warrens line to a Stake Corner
 thence on warrens line to a Stone thence on Conditional line to the
 Beginning Corner to Include Two Hundred Acres more or less to
 either with all and singular the rights members thereto lands and
 appurtenances there unto Belonging to have & to hold all and singular
 the premises above mentioned to the said Langford his heirs and
 assigns forever and I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors &
 Administrators to warrant and ever defend the same unto the said
 Langford his heirs and assigns against any person or persons law
 fully claiming the same or any Part thereof In witness whereof I have
 hereunto set my hand and Seal this the 7th November 1838 Signed
