Winthrop and Alexander Brown Executors aforesaid, in pursuance and execution of the said will have jointly bargained, sold and conveyed and by these presents do grant bargain sell and convey to the said Patty Potts all that piece, parcel or tract of land situate lying and being in Greenville District aforesaid, on Maple Creek, waters of Reedy River containing Two hundred and Sixteen acres more or less, beginning on a Post oak running thence S. 10° W. 15.00 to a Hickory, thence S. 60° E. 65 by Bush line to a pine tree to a Black Jack, thence S. 80° E. 5.00 to a Stake, thence N. 60° W. to a conditional corner bounded by Daniel Pyer, thence with the said conditional line to a pine in the original line, thence N. 60° W. to a Black Jack, thence E. 50 M. 65 to the beginning to have and to hold the said premises above described together with all and singular the rights members, hereditaments appurtenances to the same belonging, or in any wise incident or appertaining unto the said Patty Potts her heirs and assigns forever, It is witness whereof we the said Arthur C.
