made this fifth day of August in the year of our  
Lord One thousand eight hundred and forty two between Reuben  
Masten of Greenville District in the State aforesaid of the one part  
and Andrew B. Brook of the same State and District of the other part  
Witnesseth that whereas the said Andrew B. Brook stands justly  
indebted to the said Reuben Masten in the sum of Nineteen hundred  
dollars (\$1900.) it being the true amount of a note given by the said  
Andrew B. Brook to the said Reuben Masten the day and year above  
mentioned and due the fifth day of August A. D. 1849 viz. the  
principal sum, the interest to be paid annually a reference to which  
note will more fully appear. Now this indenture Witnesseth that  
the said Andrew B. Brook for and in consideration of the said debt  
or sum of payable as aforesaid to the said Reuben Masten accord-  
ing to the tenor and effect of the note aforesaid and also in consid-  
eration of the sum of one dollar to the said Andrew B. Brook by him the  
said Reuben Masten in hand paid at and before the sealing and delivery  
of these presents do grant bargain sell and release and confirm  
unto the said Reuben Masten his heirs and assigns forever a certain tract  
of Land situate in said District on the North fork of Saluda River cov-  
- taining six hundred and eleven acres more or less it being the same tract  
of Land sold and conveyed to the said Andrew B. Brook by William Thruston  
on the fifth day of August A. D. 1842 a more full description may be
