This Indenture made
 the thirtieth day of August in the Year of our Lord
 one thousand eight hundred and forty two and in the
 sixty seventh year of American Independence Between Thomas H. Todd of
 the State of Mississippi of the one part and Burchet R. Roper of the State of
 Mississippi of the other part. Whereas the said Burchet R. Roper is seized
 to her and to her heirs in fee simple of the following slaves (viz:) Morris, Matti-
 -son, Emanuel, Jane and her Child, also of an interest in some lands in Madis-
 -son County Alabama, also an interest in moneys due from her grand mother
 Mrs Ropers Estate also of notes and monies now in the hands of her guardian
 amounting to about one thousand dollars also a parcel of household furniture
 and live stock. And whereas a marriage is intended by Gods permission
 shortly to be had and solemnized between the said Thomas H. Todd and the
 said Burchet R. Roper and whereas in prospect and consideration of the
 said intended it hath been agreed by and between the said parties to
 these presents That all and singular the said Slaves Morris, Mattisoun
