 Whereas the honorable P. J. Wason the honorable P. J. Wason the honorable P. J. Wason
 one of the Judges of the courts of law in the State aforesaid by
 virtue of the power vested in him as one of the Judges of the said State
 by the act of the legislature of the said State passed the 18th day of December 1827 did on
 the application of John Moore, Roy McCoy, John Cox & others did appoint me to act as
 Coroner and to execute final process against the property of David Henning then Sheriff
 of Greenville District, which appointments I accepted & acted under, To all whom these
 presents shall come, I David Hoke Special Coroner for Greenville District State of South
 Carolina by virtue of sundry writs of fieri facias issued out of the
 Court of Common Pleas held for the District of Greenville, dated the 30th day of January 1840,
 at the suits of Peter Couble against David Henning, of R. Loveland & Benajah Nunham
 against David Henning to me directed commanding me that of the goods & chattels lands and
 tenements of the said David Henning to levy three thousand six hundred & ninety ^{dollars}
 eighty five cents damages & costs, I have seized a part of the lands & tenements of the said
 David Henning all that piece parcel & tract of land containing twenty one acres & three
Roods situate & being in the district of Greenville State aforesaid lying a short distance
 from South of the Village of Greenville adjoining lands of F. Hall Good and the
 Greenville Academies on the South of Dr. Wood on the West of David Long & Dr. Stone on
 the North & of William Choice Jr on the East & has such shape marks & corner stakes as
 are represented by the two small plots connected together and with a larger one hereto
 annexed being the three pieces of land which the said David Henning purchased from
 Edward Craft, P. E. Luman & others, and whereas the said premises with their
 appurtenances since the seizure by me made by virtue of the said writs of fieri facias before
 mentioned have been exposed to sale at public vendue & purchased by William Choice Jr
 of the District of Greenville for the sum of six hundred & ten dollars being the highest sum
 that was bidder therefor, Now Know Ye, that I David Hoke Coroner as aforesaid
 by virtue of the said writs of fieri facias aforesaid to me directed & delivered as aforesaid
 & by virtue of the Statute in such case made & provided and for & in consideration of the
 said sum of six hundred & ten dollars to me in hand paid or secured to be paid by
 the said William Choice Jr, the receipt & payment whereof I do hereby acknowledge
 have granted, bargained, sold & by these presents do grant, bargain & sell unto the
 said William Choice Jr, his heirs & assigns forever the said tract piece & parcel of
 land with its appurtenances & all the estate right title & interest which the said
 David Henning of right had of, in & to the same, To have & to hold the said
 piece, parcel & tract of land with its appurtenances unto the said William
 Choice Jr his heirs & assigns forever as fully & absolutely as I the said David Hoke
 might, could, or ought to grant, bargain & sell the same by virtue of the Statute
 aforesaid & the said writs of fieri facias or otherwise, In witness whereof I the
 said David Hoke have hereunto set my hand & seal the 17th day of September
 in the year of our Lord 1842, and in the 67th year of the Sovereignty & Independence
 of the United States of America, Sealed and delivered in the presence
 of Thomas S. Turner & W. Blasingame
