Poynes Esquire, Commissioner of the honorable Court of Equity for Greenville District at Greenville City, in the said State, of the one part, and James Huff & Philemon Huff of the other part. Whereas Anne B. Dacus, the widow of Paschall Dacus, Louisa A. Huff & Philemon Huff & others, the Heirs of the said Paschall Dacus, on or about the day of June A. D. 1839, did exhibit their petition in the Court of Equity, at Greenville City, in the said State, praying for a petition to be made by the said Court of the Lands of the said Paschall Dacus amongst his heirs at Law, by due course of proceedings
