


Elizabeth Callaway

Know all men by these presents that I, Elizabeth Callaway
 of the State of South Carolina, and the District of
 Greenville have bargained & sold unto William Cox
 for the sum of fifty dollars, paid, a certain tract or
 parcel of Land in the State & District above said containing by estimation
 fifty acres, more or less, lying on the small branches of Truck Creek and,
 bounded as follows on the North West by James Holcombs land, and passing
 his lines till it intersects Allen, lands thence with his lines to a certain point
 which will correspond with a cross fence which is a conditional line
 between said land and Saats land thence from said point to the said
 fence to perime the fence to the corner, thence from the corner of the
 fence making a right angle west till it intersects a small branch
 thence along said branch to its source, thence from the source of said
 branch in a direct line until it intersects Spriggs line, thence with
 his lines & land till they intersect Holcombs land - The said William
 Cox his heirs and assigns, Do Have and to Hold the said land & premises
 from the said Elizabeth Callaway & her heirs, and from all and every other
 person or persons from having or laying any just right, title or claim
 thereto forever, Witness my hand & Seal this second day of October
 eighteen hundred & thirty three, Signed, Sealed and delivered, in
 the presence of, Jesse Stewart

 I, Peter Cauble of Greenville District, in the State
 of said, in consideration of the natural love & affection
 which I have & bear toward, my children, William
 St. Cauble, Jane Cauble & Henry St. Cauble, and
 for divers other good causes & considerations, have this day given, granted,
 & confirmed, and by these presents do give, grant & confirm unto them
 the said William, Jane & Henry the following Negro Slaves, to wit,
 I give unto the said William St. Cauble a negro girl called Hannah
 To have, hold & enjoy the said Negro Girl Hannah, to his own proper
 use & behoof to his ^{executors} heirs, administrators & assigns forever. I also hereby
 give unto Jane Cauble a certain negro girl named Martha, to
 have and to hold the said Girl Martha to her own use & behoof and
 to her executors, administrators & assigns forever, I also hereby give
 unto Henry St. Cauble a negro girl called Amittah to have and to
