Provided nevertheless and it is expressly agreed, between the said parties that if the said Willis Davenport, his executors or administrators shall well and truly pay or cause to be paid unto William Avery his certain Attorney, executors, administrators or assigns, the full sum of \$72.75 on or before the 25<sup>th</sup> day of December next, then the above Bill of Sale or Mortgage, and every article, and thing therein contained shall cease & be utterly void, or else remain in full force & virtue.
