Marriage Contract  
between Joseph Green &  
Frances Benson, both of Greenville District

Witnesseth, That the said Joseph Green and  
Frances Benson, do mutually agree by these presents that Frances  
Benson, upon becoming his lawful wife, that the said Frances Benson  
shall have the sole right of all the property she now has in possession  
or may hereafter come in possession of both personal and real es-  
tate, that said property of Frances Benson shall not be liable  
to pay the debts of said J. Green that he has contracted now or  
may hereafter contract. That said Frances Benson shall have the  
right to dispose of all the property she now has or may hereafter  
have, that sd Frances Benson shall have this right unincumbered,  
as she may desire. I, Joseph Green do further bind myself my  
heirs executors and administrators at my death to give my widow  
the tract of land whereon I may be settled, at my death and  
two of my choice hands, and my horse and buggy and one year,  
provisions, In witness whereof We have set our hands & seals  
this third of January 1843.

Know all men by these presents that  
I Arthur Barrett, in the State aforesaid,

for and in consideration of the sum of  
Four hundred dollars to me in hand paid by Oliver Barrett  
in the State aforesaid, have granted, bargained, sold & released,  
and by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and release unto  
the said Oliver Barrett, all that tract of land containing one  
hundred acres be the same more or less, situated on Mush  
Creek, branch of South Tyger river in Greenville District it  
being a part of a tract of land originally granted to John  
Portman the 5<sup>th</sup> June 1786. Beginning at a stake on John's old  
line thence S. 85. E. 36. 50 to a white oak, Thence to a Black Jack  
on Jimmy Prince's corner, the course unknown, Thence N. 30 W. 48. 28  
to a Rock thence N. 60. W. 15. 20 to a red oak thence along streets line  
to the Beginning. Together with all and singular the Rights  
Members, Hereditaments and Appurtenances, to the said Premises
