


E. 5 ch to bend in the branch, thence N. 5 ch. to a bend, thence N. 2 W. 9 ch. 50 links to a ford across the said branch thence up an old road N. 78. W. 6 ch. 78 links to a pine tree, thence N. 4. 20. E. 43 ch. 50 links to a stake 3x. thence N. 49. W. 17. ch 25 links to a stake 3x. thence N. 89. E. 15 ch. 50 links to a dead Spanish Oak on O. G. Camp's line by the side of the Rutherford road, thence S. 22 E. 47 ch. 50 links to a stake at the corner of a field. N. 75. E. 2 ch. 50. L. to a P. O. 3x. thence S. 18. E. 19 ch. to a P. O. 3x. thence S. 8. E. 36 ch. to a R. O. on the bank of the River thence up the River to the beginning containing two hundred and acres more or less.
