Bolling the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged Have given, bargained, sold and conveyed and delivered, and by these presents do give, bargain, sell and deliver to the said Thaddeus C. Bolling the following Slaves, Nemstead and Patsy, being two Negroes that my first Wife's Father gave to her by Deed of Gift. I now give them to her and my Son Thaddeus so they may be kept in the Family. Also in consequence of my son Thaddeus having his eyes injured when he was small, I then give him a Negro boy Thomas which Gift I now confirm To have and to hold all and singular the aforesaid three Slaves with the future increase of Patsy to the said Thaddeus C. Bolling his heirs and assigns forever, And I hereby bind myself, my heirs, executors and administrators and assigns, to warrant and forever defend all and singular the Slaves aforesaid and the future increase of the female unto the said Thaddeus C. Bolling and his heirs against myself and my heirs and against every person or persons whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the said Slaves or any one of them. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal the twenty-eight day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine, and in the sixty-fourth year of the Independence of the United States of America.

Deed of Gift.

by these presents, that I, Tully Bolling, of the State and District aforesaid, for and in consideration of the natural love and affection which I have for my Daughter Harriet Matilda Bolling and also for the sum of One Dollar to me in hand paid have granted, bargained sold and given, and by these presents do give, grant, bargain and sell unto Thaddeus C. Bolling, Henry G. Johnson, and Micajah Berry, Trustees, their Executors and Administrators, the following named Negroes (to wit) Deborah, Adamon, Adaline, Waddy, Nancy, Pinckney, Cato, Franky & Child, Washington, Harison, and Smith, to have and to hold the said Negroes after my death with their increase for the sole use, trust and benefit of my said Daughter Harriet Matilda Bolling, during her natural life, and after her death for the use and benefit, of the lawful issue of her body living at the time of her death, and then her ex-
