sideration of the love and good will which I bear towards my
son Ervin Green and for other good purposes, of the State and Dis-
trict abovementioned have given granted and released and by these
presents do give, Grant and release unto the said Ervin Green a cer-
tain Tract or plantations of Land lying on both sides of Marrowbone
Creek waters, of Enoree River being a part of two Tracts one being gran-
ted to George Russell the fourteenth day of February One Thousand
Seven hundred and ninety five and the other being granted unto the
said Green the Twenty Eighth day of November One Thousand Eight
hundred and Twenty six containing one hundred and Eighty one and
one fourth acres, be the same more or less.

Beginning on a White oak 3 x 6 m. on a branch,
Thence N. 89 W. 33.97 chains to a Red oak 3 x 6 m. Thence due North
to a Red oak 3 x 6 m. Thence N. 87 1/2 W. 20.48 chains to a Black
