John Adams.	Naturalization.

To the Clerk of the Court of Greenville District S. Carolina.

In obedience to an Act of Congress prescribing the mode of Naturalization the undersigned John Adams respectfully reports to the Clerk of the Court of Common Pleas for Greenville District, South Carolina, that he was born in North Britain in the Kingdom of Great Britain on the 20th day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and nine, and owing allegiance to the King of Great Britain that he sailed from the port of Greenock in Scotland, on the 17th day of October eighteen hundred and thirty four for the United States, that he landed in Charleston in the State of South Carolina on the 27th day of November 1834 which place he left immediately for North Carolina where he resided 3 1/2 years, from thence he removed to South Carolina with the intention of living in the same, that he is now thirty six years of age, & is desirous of becoming a citizen of the United States.
