

 by these presents that S. William Davenport of the State and District aforesaid

and in consideration of the sum of love and affection I have for my daughter Sicily, and one Dollar in hand to me paid by the said Sicily Vance of the State aforesaid and Laurence District have granted bargained sold and given, and by these presents do give grant bargain sell and release unto said Sicily Vance a parcel or tract of land lying in the State and District aforesaid on the waters of hersebrook of Needy River, Beginning on a S. E. 3 x thence running N. 50. W. 30. 00 to a stake 3 x bounded by land that belongs to the estate of John Anderson thence S. 52. W. 49, to a stake 3 x bounded by Tully Polling thence S. 46. E. 16. 53 to a Red oak 3 x thence S. 70<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> E. 26 to a R. C. 3 x thence S. 39<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> W. 39. 50 to the Beginning containing one hundred and sixty six and a half acres be the same more or less, but retaining to myself and my wife the privilege of using any timber on the place as long as either of us live and at our deaths to be given up to the said Sicily Vance for the use of her and the issue of her body and if she never has any children or none living at her death then the said tract of land to fall back to my estate and be equally
