All men by these presents that I William Davenport of the state and District aforesaid for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred and six dollars and a half paid to me by the said Sicily Vance of the state aforesaid and Lawrence District have granted bargained sold and given, and by these presents do give grant bargain sell and release unto said Sicily Vance for parcel lot tract of land laying in the state and district aforesaid on the waters of hereslack of Reedy River. Beginning on a S. E. 3x thence running N. 50. W. 30. 60. to a stake 3x bounded by land that belongs to the estate of John Anderson thence S. 52. W. 49. to a stake 3x bounded by Tully Polling thence S. 40. E. 16. 83 to a Red oak 3x thence S. 70. E. 26 to a R. C. 3x thence S. 89. W. 39. 50 to the Beginning containing one hundred and sixty six and a half acres be the same more or less, but retaining to myself and wife the privilege of using any timber on the place as long as either of us lives and at our deaths to be given up to the said Sicily Vance for the use of her and the issue of her body and if she now has any children or not living at her death then the said tract of land to fail back to my estate and be equally
