This Indenture, made the  
Sixth day of October in the year  
of our Lord one thousand eight hun-  
dred and forty six between T. P.

Butler Esquire, Commissioner of the Honorable Court of Equity for  
Greenwell district, at Greenwell N. C. in the said State, of the one part,  
and Alfred Cantrell of the other part.

Whereas, Geo. Hightower, E. Hightower, and others on or  
about the thirtieth day of April 1846 did exhibit their Bill of  
Complaint in the Court of Equity, at Greenwell in the said State,  
against G. Hightower widow A. Hightower, Benj. Hagood, Adam et  
al for Partition Accounts &c.

And the Cause, being at issue before the Honorable Court, came  
on to be heard at June Term, when the said Court, after full hear-  
ing thereof, and mature deliberation in the premises, did Order, Adjudge and  
Decree, that the said several Tracts of Land in the above Bill men-  
tioned should be sold at public Auction, by the Commissioner of  
the said Court, on the terms and for the purposes mentioned in their  
Secreted Order, as by reference thereto, in the Registry of the said Court,  
will appear:— And the said T. P. Butler, as Commissioner of the said  
Court, after having duly advertised the said Tracts of Land for sale, by  
public entry, on the said Sixth day of October first above mentioned  
did, then openly and publicly, and according to the custom of Auctions,  
sell and dispose of the said Tract of Land No. 4 below described, unto  
the said Alfred Cantrell for the sum of Four hundred and thirty five  
dollars, being, at that price, the highest bidder for the same. Now

the said Decree, and in consideration of the sum of Three Dollars
