To all to whom these Presents may concern, I, H. E. Lynch, of Greenville District in the State aforesaid, send Greeting: Whereas I the said H. E. Lynch in and by my four several Notes or obligations bearing date 7th day of Dec^r Eighteen hundred and Forty Six stand firmly held and bound unto George Puist of Charleston for the payment of the full and just sum of Nineteen hundred Dollars in four annual Instalments as follows, the first of said Notes payable on or before 1st day of January 1848 for five hundred Dollars - the second payable on or before 1st day

of January 1849 for five hundred Dollars - the third payable on or before 1st day of January 1850 for five hundred Dollars - the fourth payable on or before 1st day of January 1851 for four hundred Dollars.
