The above described tract of land consists of parts of three original grants, viz. one to Jacob Gardner one to Joseph Reasonover and one to John Reasonover. Together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining, to have and to hold all and singular the said premises unto the said George W. McCaull his heirs and assigns forever. And I do hereby bind myself, my heirs, Executors and administrators to warrant, and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said George W. McCaull his heirs and assigns, against myself and my heirs, and against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming, or to claim the same, or any part thereof.
