and in consideration, as well of the natural love and affection
I have and bear for my daughter Mary W. Ware the wife of
Col. J. Edwin Ware, as the sum of Three dollars to me in hand
paid by my said daughter Mary W. Ware the receipt whereof
is hereby acknowledged, ~~I have~~ given, sold bargained and
delivered and by these Presents ~~Do~~ give, sell, bargain and
deliver unto my said daughter Mary W. Ware the following
Slaves, namely Peggy about twenty years of age and her
children Anne about two years of age and Ellen and
Ansel twins about three months of age and Crawford about
fifteen years of age to have and to hold the above named
five slaves with the future issue and increase of the females
unto the said Mary W. Ware for and during her natural life
and at her death the aforesaid slaves and their increase, if
any, are to vest in, belong to, and be equally divided between
the children of the said Mary W. Ware living at her death,
and should any of her children marry, have issue and die, leav-
ing issue, during the life of the said Mary W. Ware then such
issue to take and have such share and part as the ancestor
would have been entitled to, had he or she, been living at the
death of the said Mary W. Ware.

And I do hereby warrant and forever defend the
rights of the aforesaid Slaves unto the said Mary W. Ware for
