Stone of the State and District aforesaid the receipt whereof I do hereby acknowledge have Granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said William H. Stone, a certain Tract or parcel of Land lying on both sides of Princes Creek branch waters of Enoree River containing one hundred acres be the same more or less. Beginning on Stake 3 x 0 m Thence S 65 W. 39. chains to stake 3 x 0 m Thence S 25 E 20. chains to stake 3 x 0 m, by Pine, Thence Due East 24.50 chains to P. Call 3 x 0 3 x 0 m, Thence Due North 40 chains to Stake 3 x 0, m, the Beginning Corner Together with all and singular the rights members Hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining To Have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said William H. Stone his heirs and assigns forever and I do hereby bind myself my heirs Executors and Administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said William H. Stone his heirs and assigns forever. forever against myself and my heirs and against every other person or persons whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof Witness my hand and seal this the Twenty fifth day of November one thousand Eight hundred and forty three and in the Beginning of the Sixty Eighth year of American Independence.
