Robertson and his heirs and assigns forever, all that tract of land situated in said District on the waters of South Tye a river bounded by lands of William W. Robertson Robert Petman Wellington Barton and Pleasant Barton, containing One Hundred and fourteen Acres more or less, being parts of two original grants one to William Davis and one to Winchen Holcombe, with the appurtenances, tenements belonging and all estate right title interest claim or demand, which the said Thomas Howard received, at the time of his death had in or to the same

To have and to hold the said tract of land together with all and singular the premises, improvements and appurtenances to the said William W. Robertson and his heirs and assigns forever
