C. Prince and his heirs and assigns forever against myself and all other persons claiming or attempting to claim the same or any part thereof to which I am in any way entitled as one of the heirs or distributees of the said James Callaway or the said Charlotte Callaway or as a remainder now in the Que of the said Henry Prince to the said Charlotte Callaway And I do hereby empower the said P. C. Prince to demand sue for and recover the said Interest in the said property and receipt for the same in my name

Francis Green To 483 Abraham Green	Mortgage	State of South Carolina } Guerritt District } That I Francis Green widow of the late Sary Green deceased, all of the State and District aforesaid in consideration of Seven hundred and ninety four dollars which I am justly indebted to the estate of Sary H. Green, deceased, both bargained sold and delivered and by these presents doth bargain, sell and release in in plain and open market deliver unto Abraham Green the following property to wit - One negro man Will about Forty Five years of age and one ngr. child about seven years of age To have and to hold all and singular the said property together with the future issue and increase of the said slave child unto the said Abraham Green his Executors, administrators and assigns forever. Provided nevertheless and it is expressly agreed between the said parties, that if the said Francis Green the executor administrators or assigns shall will and truly pay a cause to be paid unto the said Abraham Green his certain attorney administrators or assigns the full sum of Seven hundred and Ninety Four dollars or a before the 25 <sup>th</sup> day of October 1849 then the above bill of sale and every article therein contained
