which I bear to my son Dr Wm Butler of Greenville District and in consideration of
one Collar to me paid have given granted, bargained, sold and conveyed and by
these presents do give grant bargain sell and convey unto the said William Butler
his heirs forever a certain tract a parcel of land situated in Greenville District
near Pikes mountain containing fifty acres more or less and hath such shape and
bound as lies as are particularly set forth in a deed of conveyance executed
by Mary Pike to myself on the twentieth day of May One thousand eight hundred
and twenty eight

So have and to hold all and singular the said premises together
with the rights members hereunto and appurtenances thereto belonging or in any
wise appertaining unto the said William Butler his heirs and assigns forever
and I do hereby bind myself and my heirs Executors and administrators to warrant
and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said William Butler
and his heirs and assigns, against myself and my heirs and against every other
person lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof

of Our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Forty nine and in the second
Year of the Sovereignty and Independence of the United States
of America
