 eration of the sum of Five Dollars to me paid by Thomas W Malone of
 the place in the State aforesaid, have granted bargain'd sold and released and
 have Presents do grant, bargain sell and release unto the said Thomas W
 Malone Two Hundred Acres of Land being the South east portion of that
 tract containing Four Hundred and fifty five acres conveyed to John C
 as to Michael W. P. being and being in Greenville District or Town
 and also a branch of the South Fork of Saluda River and also
 all firm marks and bounds as represented by a Plat of John C. Hoyle
 which Survey or made the third day of August 1837 (thirty seven and attach-
 ed to the Record made by John A. Gilman Superintendent of Public Works to John C.
 as bounded towards the North by lands now a late claim of a Gentleman East of
 whose course called a creek

Together with all and singular the Rights Members and Heredi-
 tary and Appurtenances to the said Premises belonging or in any wise incident or apper-
 taining to the said Premises together with the said Thomas W. Malone
 His and Assigns forever and I do hereby bind myself my Heirs Executors
 Administrators to warrant and firm defend all and singular the said premises
 unto the said Thomas W. Malone His Heirs and Assigns against me and mine
 and all persons lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof
