 of Guilford District and State aforesaid have granted, bargained, sold and  
 conveyed and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said  
 John Townsend all that tract of land which lies now lying on the North  
 west side of the Golden Grove Creek containing Two Hundred and seventy  
 five acres or less, beginning on Spanish Oak 37 on S 36 E 29 to ash 37 on thence  
 S 87 E 17 28 to stake 37 on thence S 12 W 12 10 to Poplar 37 on thence N 75 W 8  
 to Machine branch thence S 30 W 7 to Magnolia 37 on thence N 85 W 10 21 to  
 Oak 37 on thence S 83 E 43 39 to a Poplar on Green Creek thence  
 N 40 W 4 to Stake 37 on thence N 36 E 2 36 to a Walnut 37 on thence N 16 W  
 4 00 to Poplar 37 on thence N 70 E 20 46 to Stone 37 thence N 28 W 24 75 to  
 Maple 37 on thence up the meander of a branch to a poplar 37 on thence  
 to the beginning.
