Together with all our singular the Rights members and appurtenances to the same belonging in any wise incident appertaining To Have and to hold all our singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Joseph McCullough his heirs and assigns forever And I do hereby myself my heirs executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all singular the said premises unto the said Joseph McCullough his heirs and assigns against myself and my heirs and against every other person whomsoever lawfully claiming a title claim the same or any part thereof
