 of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and fifty seven
 and delivered to my son William C Wickliffe a negro woman Louisa
 and the infant son William to the estimator as the distributive share
 of the said son in my estate at the agreed valuation of one thousand
 dollars which said negroes have since continued the property of the said
 William C Wickliffe and whereas the said negro woman Louisa
 has since given birth to three children now living who are likewise justly
 the property of the said William C Wickliffe In consideration of the
 love and affection which I bear for my said son as well as in consideration of the sum of Ten dollars to me in hand
 paid by the said William C Wickliffe in further assurance of the gift
 and conveyance of the said negroes to my said son I have given and granted
 conveyed and delivered and by these presents do give convey and deliver to the
 said William C Wickliffe the said negro woman Louisa and the four
 children to the oldest a boy named William about six years old also
 my Ann four years old John two year old and Nancy Miller one
 year old all to my said son William C Wickliffe and his heirs and
 assigns forever
