Know all men by these presents

to that I James Anderson of the State and District  
aforesaid for and in consideration of the sum of Fifteen  
Hundred dollars to me in hand paid have granted bargained  
sold and released and by these presents do grant  
bargain sell and release unto Wm H Anderson of the State  
and District aforesaid all that tract or parcel of land  
known as the John Westmonland tract situate in Greenville  
District and on waters of Enore river & Gilders  
Creek containing One hundred and fifty seven acres  
more or less beginning at a beach on said river thence  
S 25 E 6 chains to a poplar stump or walnut bush & thence  
S 36 W 17.50 across the Greenville road to a persimmon &  
on Gilders creek thence up the creek with the various  
meanderings of said creek to the south line of said James  
Andersons land to a bench on the south side of said creek  
& thence S 16 W 9.50 to a stone thence nearly a south  
course on the line made by Josiah Kilgore and John  
Westmonland between them to M & C Cunninghams line  
thence S 79 E 19 lacking what the aforesaid John Westmonland  
sold to Kilgore to a stone corner the corner of M & C Cunn-  
inghams land thence N 14 E 13 to cherry & thence N 40 E 14  
50 to a red oak & near the spring branch thence down  
the meanderings of said to and across the aforesaid  
creek N 25 E 16 to a sweet gum & thence N 56 E 13 to  
an open corner thence N 85 E 6 to a cherry & near Enore  
river on the bank of the old Bed thence down the middle of
