the State aforesaid send Greeting. Whereas I the said James L Barnwell in and by my Two promissory Notes under my hand and Seal each bearing date the Thirteenth day of September A.D. 1861 each in the sum of Eight hundred and Fifty Dollars with interest from the date thereof stand firmly held and bound unto Mr W Campbell in the sum of Seventeen hundred Dollars with interest thereon as in and by said sealed Note reference being thereunto had will more fully appear

Now Know all men that I the said James L Barnwell in consideration of the said debt and sum of money aforesaid and for the better securing the payment thereof to the said William W Campbell according to the obligation aforesaid and also in consideration of the further sum of Three Dollars to me the said James L Barnwell in hand well and truly paid by the said Mr W Campbell at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged I the said James L Barnwell have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said William W Campbell all that tract or parcel of land lying situate and being in the District of Greenville and State aforesaid on the white Horse Road and Brush Creek about three miles from the Town of Greenville bounded by lands of John A Lowmes Smith Davis & Willerman, V M Bee and others being the tract purchased by the said Mr W Campbell from H H Beattie having the following metes and bounds beginning at a Hickory now stake, on the white Horse Road, J A Lowmes corner and running thence along said Road $36\frac{1}{2}$ to 14.50 to a stake 3x on said road thence 68 E 2 chs to a post oak 3x3x thence N 53 E 39 chs to Brushy Creek on the G & C Rail Road where it crosses said Creek, thence up said Creek to a Poplar 3x on thence S 58 W 33 chs to the beginning corner containing Fifty two acres be the same more or less. Together with all and singular the rights, members, hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in any wise incident or appertaining. The said land being hereby conveyed and mortgaged to the said William W Campbell to secure the payment of my Two sealed Notes above described given to him for a part of the purchase money of the Tract of Land. To have and to hold all and singular the said premises unto the said William W Campbell his heirs and assigns for ever. And I do hereby bind my self and my heirs Executors
