

Robt Hawthorn Deed State of South Carolina

To of P' Hillhouse	For Land	Greenville District

Wheras by the decree of the presiding chancellor at Summerville in the year A.D 1860 in a certain cause pending in the court of Equity for the District and State among other matters it was ordered that that one of the complainants in said cause to wit Robert Hawthorn of Winsboro in Fairfield District of this State do execute his bond with security thereto to the other complainants John P Hillhouse of this District and State as Guardian of Fatsay L Foster a minor of this District the Defendant in said case and that he the said Hawthorn also execute and deliver to the said Hillhouse Guardian as aforesaid a mortgage of a certain tract of land formerly belonging to said minor as further security to said land, and wheras said bond has been executed by said Hawthorn with William M Thomas and Alexander Mcbee of Greenville District as sureties in the penal sum of five thousand Dollars with interest from the 1st January 1860 payable annually the principal to be paid when said minor dies, marries or becomes of age. Now therefore know all men by these presents that I Robert Hawthorn for and in consideration of these premises and the sum of one dollar to me in hand paid upon the delivery of these presents that receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargain sold and release to the said John P Hillhouse Guardian of Fatsay L Foster all that tract or parcel of land situated lying and being in Greenville District of this State on Reedy River adjoining lands of Foster Garrison and Hawthorn containing two hundred and ten acres more or less and more particularly described in a deed of conveyance from William M Thomas Commissioner in Equity of Greenville District to said Robert Hawthorn and of record in Book Page 453 of the office of Records of Mecklenburg County for said Greenville District. To have and to hold said land to him the said John P Hillhouse and his successors in the office of Guardian of said Fatsay L Foster forever. Now the expressed understanding of this presents is that if the said Robert Hawthorn by his or assigns shall well and truly pay or cause to be paid to the said Hillhouse Guardian or his successors as guardian the above named sum of Twenty one hundred Dollars with the interest thereon according to the condition and terms of the above described bond which this paper is intended to secure them and in such event these presents shall be null and void otherwise they are to remain in full force and virtue. And I the said Robert Hawthorn resume to myself my heirs and assigns all right of pecuniary in and to said premises until default of payment of said bond so made signed sealed and delivered on the day of 5th January A.D 1862 and in the 87th year of the sovereignty and independence of the State of South Carolina
