To all to whom these presents shall come, or be made known, or whom the same may in anywise concern,  
I S J Douthit Judge of Probate for the County of Greenville in the said State send greeting. Whereas M A Watson our or about the 5<sup>th</sup> day of October 1878 did exhibit her petition in the Court of Probate at Greenville Court House, in the County of Greenville and State aforesaid against E A Phillips and A A Hudson, and the cause being at issue before the Honorable Court aforesaid, came on to be heard on the 25<sup>th</sup> day of November 1878 when the said Court after full hearing thereof, and mature deliberation in the premises did order adjudge and decree that the tract of land belonging to the Estate of O P Phillips deceased, hereinafter mentioned and described should be vested in E A Phillips at the sum of Five hundred and forty eight Dollars the appraised value of the same. Now know all men by these presents that I the said S J Douthit Judge of Probate as aforesaid, in consideration of the premises and also in consideration of the sum of Five Dollars, paid me by the said E A Phillips, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said E A Phillips and his heirs and assigns, all that tract of land situate lying and being in the County of Greenville and State aforesaid adjoining lands of Chisholm Hawks and others beginning at a Black Gum 3x 0. m. thence N 83 1/4 E 21.00 to a P. O. 8.6. m. thence N 83 E 4.18 to a Stake in Road, thence N 17 W 33.50 to a stone 3x n thence N 53 1/4 W 14.25 to a stone 3x m thence S 51 1/4 W 17.18 to a stone 3x n thence S 2 1/2 W 11.88 to a stone 3x n. thence S 88 1/2 E 20.00 to a stone 3x thence S 32.6 W 25 to a stone 3x o.m. thence S 56 E 6.38 to the beginning corner corner, and containing Ninety five and three fourth acres more or less. Together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances whatsoever to the said premises belonging or in anywise appertaining, and the reversions and remainders rents issues and profits thereof; and also all the estate right title interest lower possession property benefit claim and demand whatsoever, both at law and in equity, of the said M A Watson and of all the parties to the said suit and of all other persons rightfully claiming, or to claim the same, or any part thereof by, from, or under them or either of them. To have and to hold the said tract of land with its hereditaments privileges and appurtenances unto the said E A Phillips his heirs and assigns forever. Know all men by these presents that we Mary Nicoll and James Nicoll of Greenville County in the State aforesaid for and in consideration of the sum of Four Hundred and fifty Dollars to us paid by Milton Trammell of Greenville County in the State aforesaid have granted bargained sold and released and by these presents do grant bargain sell and release unto the said Milton Trammell a certain tract piece or parcel of land lying and being situate in Greenville County and State aforesaid on Musch Creek waters of South Tyger River and is part of the tract of land Willed to us by Washington Nicoll late of the County and State aforesaid by his last will and testament dated June the 19<sup>th</sup> AD 1868 and runs as follows beginning on a Stake 3x in Musch Creek thence N 14 1/2 W 7.15 chains to Stake 3x at end of Langley fence thence N 59 1/4 E 11.90 chains along the Langley fence to a stone 3x near a pair of Draw Bars thence N 30 1/2 W 14.25 chains to a stone 3x on line of G W and John Nicoll land thence S 72 1/2 W 24.50 chains to a stone 3x in fence corner thence S 62 W 7.40 chains to a Stake 3x in Musch Creek S 70 Nicolls corner thence down the meandering of Musch Creek 41.00 chains to the beginning corner containing Sixty Acres more or less bounded by lands of D B Nicoll Benjamin Boswell G W and John Nicoll and ourselves. Together with all and singular the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident or appertaining. To have and to hold all and singular the premises before mentioned unto the said Milton Trammell his heirs and assigns forever. And we do hereby bind ourselves our heirs executors and administrators to warrant and forever defend all and singular the said premises unto the said Milton Trammell his heirs and assigns, against us and our heirs and all other persons lawfully claiming or to claim the same, or any part thereof.
