of Greenville County in the State of aforesaid, have granted  
bargained sold and released, and by these presents do  
grant bargain sell and release unto the said Kozekiah  
Patson all that certain tract of land situated lying and  
being in Greenville County and State of aforesaid on  
Peasen dam Creek, waters of Enoee River beginning  
at a Post Oak corner &c. and running thence a straight  
line N. W. to a Red Oak &c. thence E. to a sweet gum  
stump at the bridge over the creek, on the road,  
thence down the meanders of the creek to a Chestnut  
stump &c. thence S. E. to a stump &c. at the branch, thence  
up the meanders of the branch to a Black gum &c. thence  
N. W. to a Red Oak corner, thence W. to a Red Oak  
corner - thence W. a straight line to the beginning Post  
Oak corner and containing one hundred acres better  
or more or less. Together with all and singular the  
rights members hereditaments and appurtenances to the  
said premises belonging, or in anywise incident or apper-  
taining. To have and to hold, all and singular the said  
premises before mentioned unto the said Kozekiah  
Patson his heirs and assigns forever, and I do hereby  
bind my heirs executors and administrators to warrant
