Whereas Rodolphus Long of Greenville County in the State aforesaid, on the 26<sup>th</sup>

day of September 1872 filed a Petition in the District Court of the United States for the District of South Carolina praying the benefit of the Act of Congress, entitled an act to establish a Uniform System of Bankruptcy throughout the United States, approved March the 3<sup>d</sup> 1867 upon which he was duly adjudged a Bankrupt, and whereas on the 16<sup>th</sup> day of October 1872 the day appointed for the meeting of the creditors of said Bankrupt the undersigned was duly appointed assignee of the estate of the aforesaid Bankrupt by W. J. Claibson Esq. one of the Registers in Bankruptcy of said Court to whom the adjudication was referred by Hon Geo S. Bryan Judge of said Court, and whereas the said W. J. Claibson Register thereupon assigned to him the whole of the Real and personal Estate of the said Rodolphus Long Bankrupt, and whereas on the 5<sup>th</sup> day of June 1873 under instructions from W. J. Claibson Register in Bankruptcy, when it was supposed that a Bankrupt was entitled to a Homestead against all debts without reference to their character or time when contracted called in appraisers and caused a Homestead to be laid off to said Bankrupt out of a portion of a lot situate in the City of Greenville and State of aforesaid fronting on Richardson Street and bounded on the South by Coffee St. on the West by lot of E. O. Bacon, and on the North by lot of Mrs. Mariah Thompson, being the real estate in the possession of said Bankrupt at the date of filing his said Petition in Bankruptcy and returned in the schedule of his estate, and whereas a Petition was submitted by me to the United States District Court for the District of South Carolina praying for advice and for sale of encumbered property of said Bankrupt and our said Petition it was referred by the Hon Geo S. Bryan Judge of said Court to Paul W. Claibson Register to report upon the several liens established with the aforesaid and respective priorities, and whereas said
