of Greenville of the County

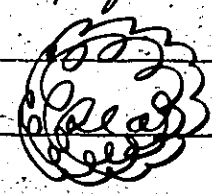
of Greenville in the State aforesaid for and in consid-

of land situate lying & being in the corporate limits
of the City of Greenville in the State and County aforesaid
and within the enclosure known as Springwood Cemete-
ry, and described in a Plat of said Cemetery made
by S. L. Norman as lot No. 12 to which Plat reference
is hereby directed for a more particular description
of the same.

Together with all and singular the
rights members hereditaments and appurtenances
to the said premises belonging or in anywise incident
or appertaining. To have and to hold all and singular
the said premises before mentioned unto the said J. H.
Whitner his heirs and assigns forever, and it does
hereby bind itself to warrant and forever defend all
and singular the said premises unto the said J. H. Whit-
ner his heirs and assigns, against itself and every
person or persons whomsoever lawfully claim-
ing, or to claim the same, or any part thereof.

one two horse wagon; one Buggy and
harness; all my household furniture of every
kind and description; all my kitchen furniture
plantation tools wagon and plough harness
all the crops of every kind and description
now growing on the lands or hereafter to be
grown or raised on the lands heretofore con-
veyed by me to her also every other kind and
description of personal property which I now own
and possess not herein before specifically enum-
merated. To have and to hold all and singular
the personal property before mentioned and
referred to unto the said Harrist Wasson
