hand paid at and before the sealing of these presents by  
R. P. Goodlett deceased, to Charles Alfred deceased,  
previous to the purchase of Springwood Cemetery  
by the City of Greenville in the State aforesaid (the  
payment whereof is hereby acknowledged) to have  
been made, have granted and released, and by these  
presents do grant and release unto the said  
Lucretia Goodlett, wife of the said R. P. Goodlett  
deceased, all that piece or lot of lands, situate lying  
and being in the corporate limits of the City of  
Greenville in the State and County aforesaid, within  
the enclosure known as Springwood Cemetery and des-  
cribed in Plat of said Cemetery made by G. L. Norman  
as Lot No 582 to which Plat reference is hereby  
directed for a more particular description of  
the same, Together with all and singular the rights  
members hereditaments, and appurtenances to the  
said premises belonging or in anywise incident  
or appertaining, To have and to hold, all and  
singular the said premises before mentioned  
unto the said Lucretia Goodlett, her heirs and  
assigns forever, and it do hereby bind  
itself to warrant and forever defend all  
singular the said premises unto the said  
Lucretia Goodlett her heirs and assigns against  
itself and every person or persons, whomsoever  
lawfully claiming, or to claim the same, or  
any part thereof.

whereof is hereby acknowledged) have granted, conveyed  
sold and released, and by these presents do grant, convey,  
sell and release, unto the said James W. Goldsmith  
all that tract or parcel of land, situate lying and  
being in the County of Greenville and State aforesaid,  
on waters of Rocky Creek, adjoining lands  
of Thomas Goldsmith, Eliza Bigeman and others  
and containing one hundred and sixty acres  
more or less. Together with all and singular  
the rights members hereditaments and appurtenances  
to the said premises belonging or in any  
wise incident or appertaining, To have and to  
hold, all and singular the said premises before  
mentioned unto the said James W. Goldsmith his  
heirs and assigns forever. But I hereby  
unto myself, for and during my natural life,  
the control and management of the said premises  
and the privilege of receiving and enjoying the  
rents and profits thereof, and I further reserve  
unto myself absolutely the right of disposing of  
the same in any and all manner that I may think proper.
