The State of South Carolina  
To all to whom these presents  
shall come, or be made  
known, or whom the

same may in anywise concern, S. J. Douthett Judge  
of Probate for the County of Greenville in the said  
State, send greeting: Whereas Stephen L. Smith on  
or about 17<sup>th</sup> day of March eighteen hundred and  
sixty nine did exhibit his Petition in the Court  
of Probate at Greenville Court House, in the  
County of Greenville, and State aforesaid against  
Leviah O. Smith, Wm. M. Smith et al, and the  
cause being at issue before the Honorable Court  
aforesaid, came on to be heard on the 8<sup>th</sup> day of  
June Eighteen hundred and sixty nine  
when the said Court after full hearing thereof,  
and mature deliberation in the premises did  
order and judge and decree, that the tract of  
land belonging to the estate of Stephen Smith  
deceased, hereinafter mentioned and described  
should be vested in L. O. Smith at Three  
hundred and fifty eight Dollars, the appra-  
ised value of the same. Now known all men  
that if the said S. J. Douthett Judge of Probate  
of Greenville County in consideration of the  
sum of Three hundred and fifty eight Dollars  
paid me by the said L. O. Smith, the receipt  
whereof is hereby acknowledged, have granted  
bargained sold and released, and by these presents  
do grant bargain sell and release unto the  
said L. O. Smith and his heirs and assigns  
all that tract of land situate lying and being  
in the State and County aforesaid adjoining  
land of G. F. ... and ...

and containing Two hundred and twenty four Acres  
more or less, Together with all and singular the  
rights members hereditaments and appurtenances what-  
soever to the said tract of land belonging, or in any  
wise appertaining, and the reversions and remainders  
rents, issues and profits thereof, and also all the state  
right, title, interest, dower and demand whatsoever  
both at law and in equity of the said Stephen Smith  
deceased, and of all the parties to the said suit, and  
of all other persons rightfully claiming, or to claim  
the same, or any part thereof, by, from, or under them  
or either of them. To have and to hold the said tract  
of land with its hereditaments, privileges and appurtenan-  
ces unto the said L. O. Smith his heirs and assigns  
forever.
