

To all to whom these Presents  
shall come, I, J. F. Douthit

Master in and for the County aforesaid, doth Greet,  
Whence ever or about the 27<sup>th</sup> day of January 1876 to N. G. Gaines  
purchased of Thomas C. Gorver and Whetton Symmes Trus-  
tees a certain lot or parcel of land hereinafter mentioned  
and described for the sum of Three hundred and fifty  
Dollars and four into possession of the same, but paid  
only a part of the purchase money, aforesaid by an  
order of the Court of Common Pleas for Greenville County  
in the state aforesaid passed on the 2<sup>d</sup> day of December 1881  
in the case of Whetton Symmes against Whetton Symmes  
and Thomas C. Gorver as Trustees and others. It was among  
other things ordered adjudged and decreed that upon the  
payment of the balance of the purchase money for said lot  
of land with the interest due thereon from the day of  
Sale, the master execute and deliver to the said N. G. Gaines  
a Deed of Conveyance to said lot of land. Now therefore bind  
all men by these presents that I, J. F. Douthit Master aforesaid  
in consideration of the sum of Three hundred  
and four 3/4 dollars to me paid by the said N. G. Gaines  
the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, have good  
and valid title and released and by these presents do  
grant, bargain, sell and release unto the said N. G. Gaines  
all that lot or parcel of land situate lying and being  
in the City and County of Greenville, aforesaid  
measuring One hundred feet front on Washington Street  
by Two hundred and seventeen and a half feet in  
depth adjoining lots of Charles C. Haskin, Mrs. E. R. Bailey  
and others and containing one half of an acre more  
or less as appears from the general plot or record  
in this office of the Register of Deeds. Conveyance for  
the County aforesaid in Book L. S page 60 together  
with all and singular the rights members, tenements  
and appurtenances to the said premises belonging  
or in anywise incident or appertaining, and all the  
estate right till claimed or otherwise if  
the party to the said conveyance as of such a
