cotton, to be paid by first November 1873, 3<sup>rd</sup> note  
for two hundred pounds good lint cot-  
ton to be paid by first November 1874, and the  
fourth note for four hundred and fifty pounds good  
lint cotton to be paid by first November 1875, by  
Thomas Thomason of state and County aforesaid  
has bargained and sold unto the said Thomas  
Thomason all that tract or parcel of land contain-  
ing sixty and one half acres more or less and  
containing the following boundaries (viz) Beginning on  
an ash in the Hope well Spring branch, thence  
N 62° W 170. to a stake 3x. Thence S 43° W 104. to a stake  
3x. Thence S 52° E 64. to a stake 3x. Thence S 31° W 72  
to a stake 3x. Thence S 64° E to the Thomason Spring  
branch, thence up the said branch to W.A. Jennings  
line, thence N 62° W along the said Jennings line to the  
beginning corner, it being a portion of the Robert  
Thomason tract of land, and sold by the said Thom-  
ason to W.A. Jennings, originally granted by His  
Excellency W. M. Calhoun to Peter Ovington the 6<sup>th</sup> March 1786  
situate lying and being in the County and state  
aforesaid in the waters of Cripple Creek, together  
with all and singular the rights members ten-  
ements and appurtenances to the same  
belonging or in anywise incident, to have and
